

What is the Indianola Promise Community?

The Indianola Promise Community (IPC) is a community-based initiative to provide children with the opportunity to succeed in school, graduate, and attend college. While it is sponsored by Delta Health Alliance, its many local partners include: Indianola School District, City of Indianola, Delta State University, B.B. King Museum, W.K. Kellogg Foundation, and many others. Our office is located at 135 Front Street in Indianola, though we have staff and volunteers working throughout the city. And while we sponsor many programs, we have one priority making sure children in Indianola have the opportunities they need to excel, so they "never miss a beat" from birth to college graduation.

IPC unites health care, education, government, community, and faith-based services to develop a "pipeline" of resources, from prenatal care through high school and college graduation, creating a path for students to gain meaningful careers and earn financial independence. We want to ensure Indianola children are ready for school, that students who need help get help quickly, and that young people stay in school through graduation and transition to postsecondary education. IPC offers a collective approach, with programs and services complementing and building on each other in a coordinated fashion. Each program will be rigorously assessed against objectives and goals, to ensure its success. Ultimately, this project can break the cycle of poverty.

We recognize that we must provide pregnant mothers and small children with resources to allow a solid foundation for future achievements.


Mission


The IPC goal is clear: We can build a pipeline of care to make sure that young children are healthy, kindergarteners are prepared, and struggling students get extra help quickly.



WHAT IS THE C.A.R.E.S. MENTORING PROGRAM?

C.A.R.E.S. (Children Are Reaching Excellence with Support) Mentoring Program is in its second year of implementation at Lockard Elementary School. The program seeks to provide an avenue for a caring adult to providing academic, social, and emotional support to meet individual children's needs. The mentor becomes a positive role model for the mentee. The goal of the program is to enhance each mentee's self-esteem and to improve attendance and academics.

HOW DOES THE C.A.R.E.S. MENTORING PROGRAM WORK?

Each mentor is assigned a mentee, based upon the needs of the mentee, the availability of the mentor, and common interests as determined by a mentee and mentor profile. For example, a child who has a strong interest in computers will be matched up with a mentor who also has a strong interest in computers. The mentor and child will meet an hour each week during the school day and on school grounds. During the session, the mentor and mentee may talk, play games, work on social skills, or read. Occasionally, the mentor may assist the mentee with homework or other activities. The mentor is to be viewed as an adult role model and not as a teacher and certainly not as a second parent. Parents are critical to the success of the mentoring program. Parents meet the mentors during the Annual Meet and Greet and they are encouraged to stay in contact with their child's mentor throughout the year. In addition, parents also receive training on the C.A.R.E.S. Mentoring Program.

WHAT IS A MENTOR?

A mentor is someone who, along with parents, provides young people with support, counsel, friendship, reinforcement, and a constructive example. Mentors are good listeners, people who care, and people who want to help young people bring out their strengths.



HOW WILL MY CHILD BENEFIT FROM THE C.A.R.E.S. MENTORING PROGRAM?

Some of the signs of success are improved attendance, increased communication with friends or teachers, smiling, greater enthusiasm for school, and improved grades.
