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#### **Biloxi: Active Parenting Classes**

Biloxi Excel By 5, Biloxi Public Schools, City of Biloxi and Mississippi State University Extension Services sponsored the first "Active Parenting Classes" in the fall of 2012. Active parenting training classes are designed specifically for parents or caregivers with children ranging from 2 – 12 years of age.

Parents had the opportunity to register and participate in the free, hour long classes held twice a month in September, October and November. Supper was served and babysitting provided. Each parent received the book "Active Parenting Today for Parents" by Dr. Michael H. Popkin, PhD.

At the December School Board meeting, parents were recognized and received a "goody bag" and framed Certificate of Completion from Arthur McMillan, Superintendent, and Kenny Holloway, Board President. Children were also recognized and presented with Super Kid Certificates and goody bags.

While parenting is not the only influence on a child's development, it is the one we can do the most about. The *Parent's Guide* was designed to teach parents a method of parenting and problem solving that helps prepare children to courageously meet the challenges life will pose. The guide will help parents build relationships that bring joy and satisfaction for a lifetime.

As stated by Kim Gowdy, Instructor, Mississippi State University Extension Services, "The instruction parents received provided teaching tools for parents to become better equipped in parenting. Our children are changing and so are the things around them." Gowdy continued, "Parenting is the most difficult job, but also the most rewarding!"

Linda Perkes, Coalition Chairperson, attended the first Active Parenting Class. She noted, "The class was very well taught and applicable to our actual challenges and the homework assignments were relevant and helpful in addressing our real family concerns. I am a better parent be-


cause I have 'tools' that work. I'll keep practicing the principles we were taught."

"They say parenting doesn't come with a manual ....now it does!" stated Anna Eklund. "This class has been a true enjoyment for becoming a new parent," Christopher M. Peterson explained.

Because of parent enthusiasm for this offering the next Active Parenting Class will continue through April. As Mark Reed encouragingly noted, "We need more parenting classes".

"Learning in the early years is critical to a child's lifelong development. The neurological pathways children will later use for everything from coloring to calculus are constructed within the first few years. Enrichment through preschool is particularly important for children from low-income families.

Education gaps between children of low-income and more affluent

families start from the beginning, in the home.

A landmark 1995 study found that poor children are exposed to 30 million fewer words by age 3 than children from more affluent families. Other studies have shown that achievement gaps can appear as early as 18 months for children at risk of learning delays, such as those from low-income families."

New Albany/Union County Excel By 5's greatest news for December is: WE ARE CERTIFIED!! We certified in 16 months making us the "fastest" certified community in Mississippi. We give much of this credit to the great community in which we live! We have five licensed childcare providers who are all active in our coalition. Our licensed providers are: Grammy's Little Puddle Jumpers, Kountry Kids, Rainbow Learning Center, UAC Kiddie Academy, and Union County Head Start. We are in the process of planning our Excelebration and meeting with our steering committee to plan for 2013.

November and December were busy months for us. Our Family Resource Center held a Grand Opening and Ribbon Cutting on November 12, 2012. Parents, children, educators, and community leaders toured the facility and learned more about the mission of the New Albany/Union County

In conjunction with the grand opening, a parent workshop was held. The Early Childcare II students from New Albany High School, under the leadership of Instructor Kimberly Langley, hosted a Parent & Pre-K Make/ Take Workshop for children ages 3 & 4 at the Family Resource Center. Children rotated through stations where the high school students demonstrated ways to use common items around the house to promote learning. Sta-

tions included: name writing in shaving cream, play-doh, reading to your children, sight words on a cookie sheet, and puppet making. The New Albany/Union County Excel By 5 Coalition sponsored a Dyslexia Workshop on Thursday. December 6. The workshop focused on the following topics: Characteristics of Dyslexia, Brain Function of Dyslexics, Remediation for Dyslexics, and Faces of Dyslexia. Presenters were teachers from East Union Attendance Center: Melinda Hill, Tonya Chapin, Karen Sheffield, and Morgan Wallis. There were more than 20 workshop participants that included parents, grandparents, educators, and community members.

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#### Corinth/Alcorn County: Excel By 5 Elves and Mobile Resource Center

The Corinth/Alcorn County Excel By 5 Coalition is continuing to progress toward our certification completion. We are in the beginning stages of our certification, so we believe it is important to promote the advantages of the Excel By 5 certification and the positive results it will provide our community. Therefore, we coordinated with one of our partners, Magnolia Regional Hospital at their annual Winter Wonderland event. The event was free to the public and attracted over 3,000 children. The "Excel By 5 Elves" read to the children that were waiting in line to see Santa. We gave each child a sticker that said "I read with the Excel By 5 Elves". Many of our elves were students with the high school teacher academy at the county vocational school, but the most popular Elf was the County school district superintendent, Mrs. Gina Rogers Smith. The children loved it and the parents had an opportunity to learn more about the efforts of the Excel By 5 Coalition.

The Early Education task force is working very hard to visit with each child care center in our community to build a relationship that will ensure their participation in the Corinth/Alcorn County Excel By 5. They put together a benefits package for the participating child care centers. The benefits package includes visits from our Mobile Resource Center, opportunities to receive free CPR training from our local hospital, advertising in the local paper



as a participating child care center, easy access to extra contact hours through the school systems, a goody basket and much more. The goody basket is given to the child care center when they complete the survey and make the decision to participate in the Excel By 5 certification process. The basket includes a Wal-Mart gift card, cleaning supplies, educational books and materials, a few snacks and much more. Very quickly, Kids Country's owner Mitzi Potts saw the benefits of the certification and became our first participating child care center. Mrs. Potts also decided to serve on our Coalition and Education task force. Her enthusiasm will spark a lot of interest in the community.

Our "mobile" resource center is ready to roll! The goal is to take the resource center to the at-risk communities on a quarterly schedule, as well as the child care centers. With well trained volunteers, the strategy will be to visit with parents about the importance of early brain development by reading, talking, touching, and playing with their children, so their children are better prepared

for kindergarten and life. As we visit child care centers, we hope to provide services, testing and fun activities that they have requested for children and parents.

#### Statewide Excel By 5 Summit



#### **Delta Communities Summary**

The Excel By 5 Delta Candidate Communities which included Alligator, Duncan, Shelby (North Bolivar County), Pace, Gunnison, Rosedale, Beulah (West Bolivar County) Isola, Belzoni, Silver City, Louise (Humphreys County) made serious strides in completing the Excel By 5 requirements since the Fall 2010. However as of January 2013 (as noted on the Excel By 5 Communities 2013 Map on the following page) the

Delta Candidate Communities have decided to move forward in completing the requirements as individual Community Coalitions rather than as a County Coalition. Although starting over has not been easy, the new Candidate communities of Alligator, Duncan, Beulah, Gunnison, and Isola have been diligently working on developing new strategies, identifying resources and building local partnership to help engage the com-



#### **Excel By 5**

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Launched in the Fall of 2004, Excel By 5 is an innovative process, that is designed to encourage and assist communities to become actively involved in supporting their young children. The first of its kind, this certification program emphasizes the important roles parents and primary caregivers play in educating children during their most formative years, birth to five.





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
